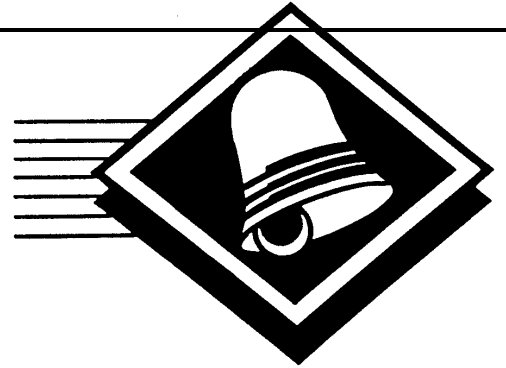

From the

Transitional Senior Pastor

The questions have begun in earnest: Have you started looking for a new position yet? When will you be leaving us? When do you start looking for a new position? You mean, you won't be staying on as our Pastor until the new settled Pastor is ready to start? I assumed that you would be here until the Sunday before our next Pastor begins.....

So, let me share in this column, the ways in which the process of the ending of my tenure as your Transitional (interim) Senior Pastor will occur and the two factors that affect the timing.

First: the search process which is on going for your next settled Senior Pastor. The Search Committee is beginning to receive and review interested applicants' profile materials and they will begin at some point following up with those which look like the best choices for this church. Their work could take just a few months or much longer, before they have a person who they have prayerfully discerned is the right person for recommending to you the members of the church.

A candidating weekend will be organized here, in which that woman or man will be introduced to the church and a vote taken to call him or her to be your Pastor. At that point, the new Pastor will give notice to the church where he or she is currently serving that a new position has been accepted. If I am still here, I will be given my 60 days notice by the church Council, that my tenure will be finished.

Second: my search process for a new interim/transitional position. I am committed to stay with you through most of the search process for your settled Pastor. And at this point I am planning that I will be here through this program year, that is, late this Spring. However, given how long this transition time has been and the intensity of the work that we have done together over the past two and a half years, I think that it would be good for there to be some gap of at least a few weeks, between the time of my ending and the time when the settled Pastor begins.

It is also the case that in the United Church of Christ, I am not guaranteed a position when my time here with this church ends. I go through a call process similar to, although much shorter than the call process for a settled position. Interim positions are created when a settled pastor leaves and the church usually wants to fill the vacancy right away. For example, I had a phone conversation about an interim position in Maine, that is opening soon and the church wants to fill by March 1st—I told them that the timing did not work for me to consider the position. I will need to begin my search process 3 or 4 months before I anticipate being finished with my time here.

I will listen to the Search Committee about how their process is moving forward in order to discern when I should initiate my own search process. It would be "ideal" if I were to be offered a new position at the same time as your candidating weekend occurred—I would be leaving a few weeks before your settled pastor began! However, it may happen that your process moves more rapidly and I am given my notice when I do not have another position to which I am called. Or alternatively, it could happen that I accept a new calling and your process is not concluded for some months after I am gone.

One of the things that I like about being in intentional interim ministry is that my search process will be known by your leadership and by you as it progresses. So all of this is very complicated and these two processes are intricately related to one another, while at the same time are separate! I invite you all to continue to pray for your Pastoral Search Committee and God's guidance in their work and also ask you to pray for me that I will be carefully listening to God's guidance for my future.

Over the next few months we will be gradually disengaging from one another, a careful process of saying "good-bye" and "God bless you" as we begin going our separate ways. All of this in God's good purposes for us.

Dr. Jay appointed to Special Commission

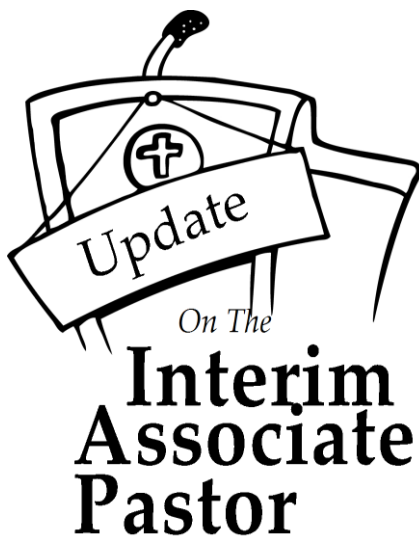


As you may be aware, the Connecticut Conference of our United Church of Christ has been struggling for several years to continue its various ministries in significant part, because of declining revenues: investments that have lost value and therefore generate less income, as well as less church and individual financial support of the Conference. One concrete result that directly impacts our church is the movement from a full time to a half time Regional Minister.

At the conference meeting in October 2009 the delegates authorized the formation of a Commission on the Sustainability of the CT Conference and invited nominations of people to participate on this vitally important commission.

Just a few days before Christmas Dr. Jay Terbush was asked to be a member of this commission, which will work together during 2010 to come forward with recommendations for the long term viability of the CT Conference. A final report is to be presented to the annual meeting of the conference next October. The Commission has met for its initial meeting and will be meeting at least once a month to evaluate the present situation and to make recommendations to the Board of Directors of the Conference to continue and strengthen the work of the state Conference.

Dr. Jay has expressed that he feels honored to be asked to serve the wider fellowship in this significant way. He has also shared with our church leadership that his selection for this role is an indication of the importance of our church to the covenant relationships we have with the congregations throughout the Connecticut Conference.

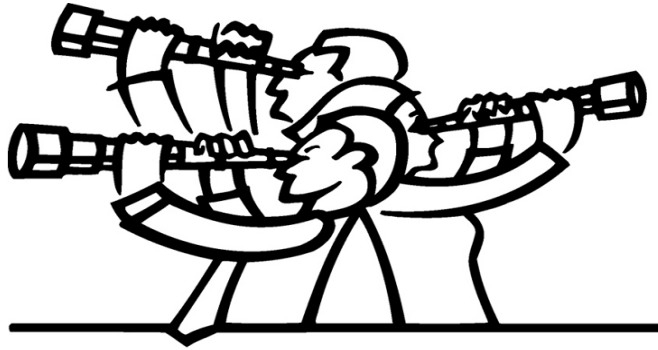


In November the Council appointed an Interim Associate Pastor Search Committee which is charged with making a recommendation to the Council of the best person to join our staff as Interim Associate Pastor. The Committee consists of Louise Wright, Chair, and members Stacy Malecki, Dudley Hamlin, Susan Dione, Lynn Brown, Maureen Davis and Dr. Jay Terbush.

A position description was developed by the Personnel Committee which includes some flexibility depending on the education and experience of the person chosen. We are anticipating this pastor to begin sometime in the next couple of months, work with Dr. Jay and the leadership of the church, then be a bridge between the ending of Dr. Jay's tenure and the beginning of the new settled Senior Pastor's tenure. We are expecting the interim associate to serve at least six months into the settled Senior Pastor's tenure.

The committee has received applications from three people –all of whom were considered qualified to be considered further. By the time you are reading this, the Search Committee will have conducted interviews with all three of these persons, and then one will be invited back for a second interview, to meet the staff and to be ultimately recommended to the Council in mid February.

The Search Committee is enthusiastic about the applicant pool and looks forward to recommending a highly qualified and faithful person to become our part time Interim Associate Pastor.



PASTORAL SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE

After completing the Local Church Profile in December, the Pastoral Search Committee used the time of Advent for reflection and prayer. As of Jan 13, 2010, our vacancy is listed in “UCC Employment Opportunities” system with the following advertisement:

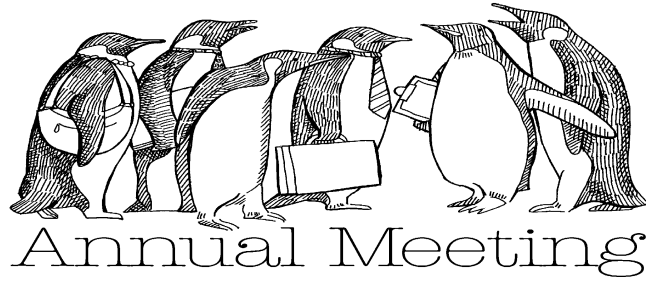
In anticipation of receiving profiles from candidates, the committee met with our Regional Minister, Rev. Susan Tarolli, on Jan. 10, 2010 to view sample profiles and discuss procedures for receiving and reading these documents. Persons who have been authorized to complete a UCC Ministerial Profile will submit profiles for our committee through the Conference/Association office. In the upcoming weeks and months, we will be reviewing these profiles, sharing our Local Church Profile with promising candidates, and following up with persons in whom we have particular interest. The follow up may include telephone reference checks, telephone interviews, and requests for sermon tapes. While pursuing these steps, we will also continue to review new Ministerial Profiles.

Please note that while the work on the Local Church Profile required the input of many people in our congregation, the names of candidates are held in strict confidence within our committee; we ask that you respect the essential confidentiality of this process. We will make every effort to keep you informed - on a regular basis - about our progress.

The remainder of the process could take six months or longer. We trust that God will guide both our candidates and the members of our committee as we work to discern the person that we will call to be our next settled pastor. Please continue to pray for the Search Committee as we work on your behalf.

Altar Flowers

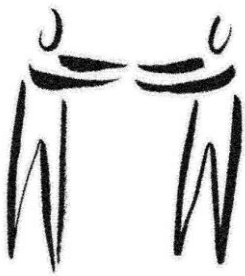

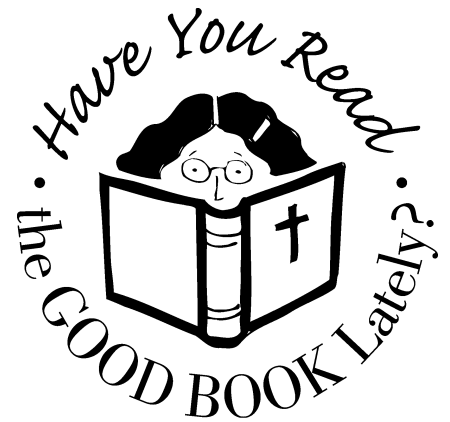
Canned meals (stew, chili, ravioli)

Personal care items

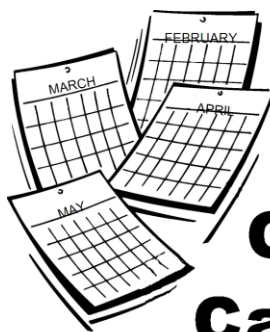

WELCOMING ALL CAMPAIGN REACHES \$1.1 MILLION GOAL

Just over a year ago, on January 11, 2009, the announcement that we would be “Kicking Off” our Family Gifts solicitation with Advanced Gift pledges and gifts of over \$887,191 brought gasps and then applause.

Over the past year, we’ve watched the figures on our “steeple thermometer” grow as the congregation has shared time, talents, and financial resources to help achieve our capital campaign goal.



On Sunday, January 24th the announcement was made that, through pledges, gifts, fundraising, and interest income, we now have over 1.1 million dollars committed to the campaign. In addition, as of that date, a total of \$687,518 or over 62 percent has already been received. This demonstrates not only the dedication of our congregation, but how important and helpful it is to pay commitments early, for our cash in hand has helped generate over \$3,000 in interest toward the overall goal.

Last year the church secured a construction loan that will be paid back over the next two years. Cash flow now can continue to make a big difference in how much and for how long we will need to draw on our line of credit and the interest we will need to pay, so please keep up-to-date with your Welcoming All Campaign pledges. To help remind us of where we stand as a congregation in income received, the focus of our “steeple thermometer” is changing to reflect income received, represented by a red line.

Also a reminder that although we’re “over the top,” the capital campaign isn’t over. The first \$100,000 raised beyond our project costs represents a tithe gift, so continued efforts to contribute remain very important. New and additional pledges and gifts are welcome at any time. You can contribute by requesting a pledge card or writing a check to Storrs Congregational Church with “Welcoming All” on the memo line. Blue Welcoming All offering envelopes are also available in the meeting house and parish house lounge.

With our elevator “Welcoming All” to the second floor, and with the vestibule saying “Welcome to Our House” each day, we are excited and yet concerned about the current and future economic times and the SCC transitions ahead. In the midst of those concerns, we know that with continued prayer and by continuing to work together, this church can complete our amazing journey toward Welcoming All, meet the other challenges that face us, and grow in our faith.

We’ll continue to do it TOGETHER.
