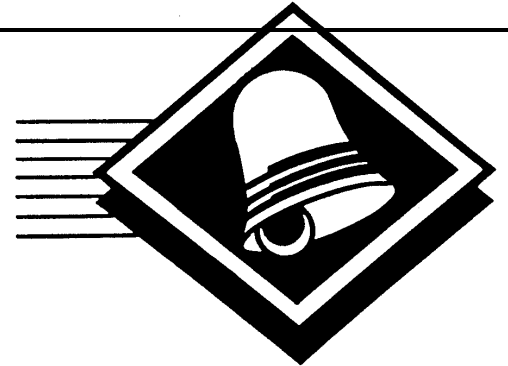

Transitional Senior Pastor: Rev. Dr. Jay M. Terbush



Our New Interim Associate Pastor is Rev. Dr. Karen Bailey-Francois

The Church Council acting on behalf of the congregation has voted to call The Rev. Dr. Karen Bailey-Francois as Interim associate Pastor beginning on March 1st. Karen was recommended unanimously and enthusiastically by the Interim Associate Pastor Search Committee which consisted of Louise Wright, Chair, Stacy Malecki, Dudley Hamlin, Lynn Brown, Susan Dione, Maureen Davis and Dr. Jay Terbush.

Karen received a BS in Accounting/Finance and an MBA from the University of Vermont. Her Masters of Divinity is from Andover Newton Theological School and her Doctor of Ministry degree is from Hartford Seminary.

She served full time at First Church of Christ in Hartford (Center Church) as Associate Minister/Minister of Christian Education from 1995 till 2006. From 2006 until 2007 she was Interim Director of the Center for Youth Programs, Hands on Hartford (formerly Center City Churches) and continued to provide part time consultation/technical support in 2008. Recently she has been doing supply preaching and helping with programs in her home church. Karen is married to the Rev. Don Bailey-Francois who is Senior Pastor of the Ellington Congregational Church and is mother to son Jonathan, age 12.

Karen began ministry in Connecticut as Interim Associate Minister for Union Congregational Church in Rockville. She served as Associate through retirement of Senior Minister at Center Church (1996-1997), with Interim Senior Minister's arrival (1997-1998) and extended transition of newly called Senior Minister (1998 and following). Karen assumed various leadership and governance roles through the research and planning process that led to Center City Churches' affiliation with the national Hands On Network (2003-2006).

She has experience working with fiscal responsibilities in churches and in industry. Stewardship is a priority for Karen. She has first hand stewardship experience in three different situations. She also has training and/or experience in conflict mediation and strategic planning.

The position will be three quarter time, not full time. Her responsibilities will include worship leadership (preaching once a month) and participating in baptism, weddings, funerals and communion services. Pastoral care including visits in homes and hospitals and support of Call to Care will be shared with Dr. Jay. She will also assist with Christian Education and serve as staff liaison to Council, Deacons, Christian Education, Outreach and Fellowship Boards. We look forward to working with Karen in the ministry of the Storrs Congregational Church.

In the last paragraph of her statement on ministry, Karen wrote: What I learn most often is that God's people are hungry for the Water and the Word, the Bread and the Cup, the promise and the nurture of new life in Christ. When we come to God's table, we come as equals in our longing for spiritual nourishment, encouragement and hope. As an ordained minister in the United Church of Christ, I have been entrusted with the responsibility and privilege of serving at that table, of preaching from the pulpit, of teaching in the places where living intersects faith and of holding out a healing hand to any and all who have a need. What a story to be able to tell. My gratitude is beyond measure.

Conference Minister Retires

The Rev. Davida Crabtree has announced that she will retire as Connecticut Conference Minister effective in mid May. Rev. Crabtree has been the head of the United Church of Christ in our state for 14 years. She announced her retirement to the Board of Directors and the conference leadership in a very personal letter in mid February.

The Connecticut Conference of the UCC has undergone significant changes under the tenure of Rev. Crabtree and is considered one of the strongest conferences in our national denomination. An interim Conference Minister will be appointed by the Board of Directors in the next few months and a national search will be initiated to identify a new Conference Minister.

Transitional Senior Pastor

During the past two and a half years, we have been doing a fair amount of prayerful discussion about our church and its sense of identity and purpose. We have been talking about such issues as: what is our mission and purpose? Who are we as the people of God? What is God calling us to do and to become?

The other day I came upon the following questions, which can apply to an individual, but work equally well for a church which is seeking to discern God's call in its corporate life. Michael Himes, who is a theology professor at Boston College, recommends to students who are facing questions about their choice of vocation or career, that they ask themselves three questions: What gives me joy? What am I good at? Do other people need me to do it?

What if we began to ask ourselves these three questions about the activities, programs, ministries of our church?

What gives us joy? Some of the activities in which we engage bring us joy, some do not. Joy is different than mere happiness. For me, joy is about a deep and abiding sense of peace and strength. Joy is contagious, sustaining and life giving. An activity may require a great deal of effort, may even be painful, but ultimately produces joy in the end. Joy is a primary indicator of the presence of God's Spirit, if it is absent, then I question whether it is something that God calls me/us to do. Some things in which a congregation engages, do not produce joy. I believe that we should seriously and honestly reflect on whether a particular activity is something that God is calling us to do, if we do not experience joy in it.

What are we good at? Church's can often spend an enormous amount of time and energy worrying about and working at improving things that are regarded as deficiencies or weaknesses. I believe that a church ought to start by focusing on what it does well, its strengths, its positive and life changing programs. Building on what the church already does well, makes 'success' more likely.

People have many expectations (sometimes widely divergent expectations) about what they want the church to be and to do. In my experience, very few churches are good at doing everything that any particular individual might want that church to be good at. And it is completely unrealistic to expect a church to meet everyone's expectations all of the time. As a church we need to articulate the expectations and then decide whether we are good at doing them. Some things that the church was once 'good' at doing, it may no longer be good at, and giving up time, energy and resources that are being in a sense 'wasted', may free them up to risk something new, something that may be better.

Do other people need us to do it? The church exists for others, not just for itself. The church is to follow her Lord, who 'went about doing good.' The life of the community of faith, must always be oriented to those outside itself. What does the world need this church to be and to do?

I invite your reflections on these three life re-orienting questions.

I am grateful to the Rev. Michael Ciba for many of the ideas in this article.

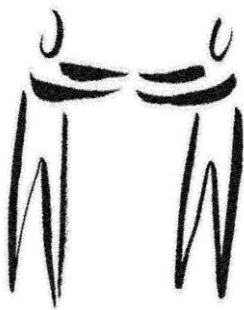
