

FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION...



For this issue of the Carillon, I would like to share with you how I typically spend fifteen hours dedicated each week while serving as your Director of Faith Formation.

Before I begin, though, I want to say how thrilled I am to be called to Storrs Congregational Church and that it has been an interesting and challenging time (during the state of affairs of the pandemic) to begin working in a new ministry setting. Your hospitality has been so very warm and inviting! As an extrovert, who gets

energized by in-person gatherings, especially while engaged in spiritual and faithful conversations, I find it more challenging to meet and get to know people in our mostly virtual ways or behind a mask. In recent conversation with other faith formation folks, I found it fascinating, although not surprising, that those who identified more as an introvert found communicating via online platforms, through social media and such, much more comfortable than those of us who are more extroverted.

On Tuesdays I begin working on the weekly issue of *Faith Seeds*, the intergenerational lesson in newsletter format. I spend an hour or so initially preparing the issue and may do some finishing touches before sending the pdf file to Claire on Thursday afternoons. For now, I am adapting a curriculum provided by *Illustrated Ministries* on The Beatitudes for this series and am reviewing possibilities for The Fruits of the Spirit for our next series. I wonder how you are finding and using your copy of *Faith Seeds*, found in your inbox each Friday in the all-church email? Do you share *Faith Seeds* with your children, grandchildren, extended family members, neighbors or friends? If so, in what ways? Do you print it out to try some of the activities and/or coloring page? Is there someone designated (or self-appointed) to read the Bible story at your dinner table or at bedtime? Do you say the blessing and prayer aloud—by yourself or with a loved one? Do you use these during *FaceTime* calls or over *Skype* or *Zoom* in some way? I welcome your ideas on how we can spread these seeds of our shared faith to nurture the spiritual lives of others.

On Wednesdays from 10:30-12:00, although I have office hours at First Congregational Church of Woodstock where I also serve as part-time Director of Family Ministry/Faith Formation, I have been facilitating **C.A.F.E. Storrs**, from there since Pastor Matt handed me the baton. After having a few Zoom bumps along the way, I am getting the hang of **Bible study** on a social media platform and am enjoying sharing the Word and meaningful conversation

with the awesome participants each week. I prepare for **C.A.F.E. Storrs** on Tuesdays by creating a slideshow of the materials provided by FaithElements.net through exploration of the lectionary scripture text(s) that will be used in worship the following Sunday.

I am learning to create video stories/lessons for *The Early Word* portion of Sunday worship and curate them on our *YouTube* channel. This way, if there is a special someone or family you want to share a particular story or lesson with, the link can be shared electronically. Before I select the specific story for *The Early Word*, Pastor Debbie and I talk about the Scripture passage(s) and theme for worship. Many times, a *Godly Play* story may be adapted to fit with the worship theme and I gather or create props for the stories. Learning how to set up my smart phone on a tripod to video myself (often multiple times for a better camera angle or for other editing reasons) then posting the video on YouTube are new to me and stretching me out of my comfort zone. I am starting to enjoy this new way of storytelling (and it is beginning to take less than the 6-8 hours it had been at the beginning.) I do, however, prefer to have live participation with curious children with whom to wonder!

Other special events and faith formation opportunities I have recently worked on/am working on include a Brian McLaren, *We Make the Road by Walking* **book study**, **Centering Prayer** offering each Thursday mornings at 8:00AM (during the Lenten season), and a fun, virtual **Fat Tuesday Pancake Supper** held in February. I look forward to facilitating the faith journey with members of our current **Confirmation** class. We are exploring the possibility of participating with SNEUCC online mini retreats and making a plan to fit the needs of the youth as we experience **Confirmation** in new formats during the pandemic.

Looking ahead to summer, Pastor Debbie and I are in conversation about creating a version of *Mission Possible*, a week-long summer camp experience, primarily for middle school students to experience their faith in action. Please send me an email if you are interested in being on the *Mission Possible* team! My office hours are typically, Tuesday and Thursday from 10:00 am- 4:00 pm and I am at SCC worship services virtually, for now, on alternate Sundays. I can be reached at lisa@storsscongchurch.org.

FROM YOUR COMMUNICATIONS AND DIGITAL MINISTRY SPECIALIST



Hi, all! For those in the congregation who I haven't met (virtually or in-person) my name is Claire Galvin and I am SCC's new Communications and Digital Ministry Specialist. I wanted to take some time to update church members about my contributions so far, my day-to-day duties and my goals for the position, and the church, in the future

As this position was created, I was attracted to the variety of tasks it involved and the flexibility and

creativity it afforded. In my first four months, I have worked on virtual fundraising and charity efforts, Sunday worship materials preparations, Sunday online worship, video production for social media, articles for newsletters, distributed eNewsletters, advertisements, social media development, website development and more.

When Pastor Matt left the church, I worked to ensure a smooth transition to new leadership, especially as it relates to Sunday worship. With the help of tech gurus Andy McCabe, Erin Scholes and Susan Irvine, I work in the Meeting House every Sunday morning for about 3 hours to oversee online worship.

On Mondays and Tuesdays I start to prepare our three weekly emailed newsletters. In total, the newsletters take about 2 hours throughout the week. Recently, I have taken advantage of a biweekly tech deacon roundtable led by the SNEUCC on Tuesdays that lasts about 2 hours. On Wednesdays and Fridays I format the content Pastor Debbie provides to create Sunday's bulletin, PowerPoint and annotated bulletin to help the tech team. This usually takes about 3 hours.

This usually leaves me about 5 hours for miscellaneous duties that may come up. I try to update the SCC web and social media pages regularly, meet with congregation members about their communication ideas, troubleshoot issues with Zoom or other online services, write and photograph content for the printed or emailed newsletters, and much more.

All of these duties place my weekly hourly total at (usually a minimum of) 15 hours per week. In fact, during the months of November, December and January, I averaged 16 hours per week. I tracked my hours and shared them with Pastor Matt, and now, Pastor Debbie.

In the future, I hope to tackle the following projects: create, distribute and analyze a marketing and communication survey to congregants; update the SCC website, especially focusing on a redesign of the homepage; create a universal marketing plan for the SCC Facebook, Instagram and Twitter, including the creation and distribution of post "templates"; utilize congregant articles, photos or videos as "contributed content" on the SCC website and social media; continue online worship accessibility when in-person worship resumes; begin in-person outdoor worship when weather permits; spotlight SCC staff, volunteers and members in video interviews; and much more.

Please keep in touch and let me know how I can better serve church members and the church. I'm eager to hear suggestions about ways to improve our digital ministries. My email is claire@storrscongchurch.org.

BUILDING & GROUNDS NEWS

UTILITY ROOM WORK (CONTINUED)



You'll perhaps recall from last month's *Carillon* that the pressure tank in the utility room (off the passageway between the Education Wing and Parish House) was being replaced in February because of leaking from the old one. Before the new tank is installed, it has been decided to relocate the Internet equipment that has been sitting on a chair in the utility room since it was first connected. The heat and humidity in that room presents a less than ideal location for any electronic equipment. The fire panel and fire alarm system was moved out for that reason and also because a costly lightning strike affected all the communication devices located there

several years ago. With the expertise of both our electrician and Andy McCabe, the internet equipment will be enclosed in a box that will be placed next to the alarm system in the hallway (near the elevator, across from the women's room). While these changes won't guarantee total safety for our operating systems, at the very least the clutter in the utility room will be greatly reduced.

SERVICE SEWING UPDATE




Is there any aspect of life at SCC that hasn't been or doesn't continue to be affected by the pandemic? Normally this would be the time of year that our Service Sewing Group would be busily assembling and boxing school and health kits for delivery to the Church World Service depot in

Meriden. Last year, our contribution was part of the **13,020 school kits and 27,760 health kits** distributed throughout the United States. Additionally, **2,700 school kits and 8,250 health kits** were sent out globally by CWS. In spite of COVID restrictions, some members of our group continue to make school bags and dresses while working from home. Hopefully, our group will soon be able to meet once again and continue our outreach to Church World Services. As always, new members are welcome to join (in person or remotely) our group in this vital and personally fulfilling project.

SENIOR SETTLED MINISTER SEARCH STATUS

Dear Members and Friends of Storrs Congregational Church,

As members of the Senior Minister Search Committee, we want to express our continued gratitude for the trust you have placed in us. One of the first steps in calling a Settled Senior Minister is the compilation of a Profile of the Storrs Congregational Church that describes who we are now and invites us to discover who God is calling us to become so that we can better discern who God is calling to minister to us. We are currently drawing on information from our Annual Reports and from the results of the Congregation Assessment Tool - the CAT scan we took about a year ago. We have assigned other portions of the Profile to Committee members for the preparation of preliminary drafts, and on Sunday, February 21 we utilized time during the Zoom breakout rooms to give you time to share your thoughts on "What are some of the strengths or positive qualities of our congregation?" and "What constitutes good preaching?" As the initial drafts of Profile sections are completed, we will be spending large portions of our weekly meetings prayerfully and collectively finalizing the language. Our goal is to complete the Profile in May, after which our vacancy will then be listed in "UCC Employment Opportunities." We ask you to pray for us regularly as we continue the search process.

Mar 14, 2021 - Daylight Saving Time Starts



When local standard time is about to reach the date/time of Sunday, March 14, 2021, *2:00:00 AM* clocks are turned *forward* 1 hour to Sunday, March 14, 2021, *3:00:00 AM* local daylight time instead.

Sunrise and sunset will be about 1 hour later on Mar 14, 2021 than the day before. There will be more light in the evening.

Also called Spring Forward, Summer Time, and Daylight Savings Time.

ADVOCACY ON NUCLEAR WEAPONS

The United Church of Christ (UCC) has been vocal in our opposition to the development, possession, testing, and use of nuclear weapons throughout our history. Just two years into our covenantal life as the newly formed UCC, the second General Synod in Oberlin, OH (1959) issued A Call to Christian Action in Society that called for the "effective international control and reduction of all national armaments, including testing of nuclear weapons." Years later in 1979, the UCC's General Synod again called for the reversal of the "arms race" and based on our relationship with partners in Micronesia, we have continued to advocate for the end of nuclear testing. In 1999 General Synod affirmed a resolution calling for redress for the damage caused by U.S. testing in the Marshall Islands.

In 1985, Synod issued the groundbreaking Just Peace Pronouncement that articulated our theological position on issues of war and peace based on a call to address systemic injustice. Over the past 30 years as a Just Peace Church the United Church of Christ has reaffirmed these positions in support for the Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty (CTBT), the New START agreement, and, most recently, the UN Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons.

As you can see from the above information, it's important for us as a Just Peace Church to be aware of the national activities of the United Church of Christ. This piece illustrates the UCC's positions on working to reduce and eliminate nuclear weapons.

If you go to google and look up United Church of Christ Just Peace Nuclear weapons, you will find all kinds of resources and information. You can write to your legislators to support the UN Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons. Watch the next newsletter for more on this issue and specific actions you can take.


