Governing Board Minutes

Regular Meeting - June 09, 2021

Sue Irvine called meeting to order with prayer at 7:32 PM.

Consent Agenda items were approved

That the Board approves the Minutes of the May 12, 2021, meeting of the Board. **.A.**

1. That the Board acknowledges receipt of the June 2021 Pastoral Report. **.A.**
2. That the Board acknowledges receipt of the May 2021 report of the Buildings and Grounds Coordinator (Duffy Brookes). **.A.**
3. That the Board acknowledges receipt of the April and May 2021 Treasurer's reports. **.A.**
4. That the Board acknowledges receipt of the June Just Peace meeting minutes. **.A.**
5. That the Board approves use of the Major Projects account to cover the \$3,412.47 expenses associated with expansion tanks replacement/moving and associated plumbing
6. That the Board approves use of Major Projects account to cover the \$2307.39 expenses associated with moving electronics/communications & routing hard Ethernet to the library.

There was nobody present to speak at this evening's meeting. However, there were a couple miscellaneous business items to discuss:

1. Sue reported that the Beach Portrait that has been displayed in the Memorial Room has been returned to the Benton Museum of Art in support of museum accreditation process. The portrait may be

returned to the church after the accreditation process is completed. If it is not returned, the expectation is that we will receive a copy of the portrait that we would be able to display.

2. The board agreed to hold governing board meetings at 7PM in July in August (since Vespers service will be paused for the summer)
3. Deborah will be on vacation the week of June 28 and also a week in August. We discussed having congregation members provide office coverage from 9AM-2PM during this time. Paul will follow-up with Deborah for list of people who have done this in the past and work to identify a coverage plan. There was some discussion about responsibilities – primarily greeting and helping visitors get where they need to be. We agreed that mail (which could contain checks) should not be opened, but should be locked in the desk until Deborah returns.

Task Force for Resuming In-person Worship: Task Force recommends returning to in-person worship in a way that is consistent with CDC and state guidelines. If guidelines change, we will change our practices. It was noted that singing is ok! Notices similar to those currently on the education building (about masks optional for fully vaccinated people and required for unvaccinated people) will be posted on the sanctuary entrances. Social distancing will be accommodated. Plan is to begin in-person worship in the sanctuary on June 20.

MOTION: Cass made a motion to accept the recommendation of the task force and begin in-person worship on June 20 consistent with CDC and state guidelines. Paul seconded motion. It passed unanimously.

Same rules/guidance will apply for other events and meetings. There will be some flexibility for event organizers to require more stringent use of masks for specific events.

The use of technology and support for remote access to services was discussed. There was agreement on remaining flexible with expectation that we would continue to provide a hybrid worship experience in a way that leveraged the improved audio/visual equipment that we purchased, but that reduced the duplication of visual service support (i.e. bulletin will be the primary worship aid – the PowerPoint presentations will not be continued) Pastor Debbie will prepare a communication for congregation in advance of 6/20 worship. The new hybrid format will evolve over the next few months with input from the technology experts.

It was agreed that Governing Board meetings will be in person in July. There will be options for remote participation.

Pastor Debbie Pastoral Report: Some highlights include:

- Continue with pastoral care with hospital and home visits; reaching out to members/friends through cards, email, and phone calls
- New Members will be received at outdoor service on June 13
- Participated in garden service for family of Paul and Sue
- Welcomed the Rev. Liz Garrigan-Byerly, Area Conference Minister, as guest preacher on May 16
- Presented at Hartford Seminary's Community Prayer on May 19: "My String of Pearls: From China to Haiti as a Global Volunteer"
- Facilitated lead ministry coordinators meeting on May 26
- Planned for Community Service Project Sunday on June 6 providing various opportunities for service followed by coffee hour and Communion in the Parish House
- Participated in Eagle Scout ceremony for Will Huey on June 6
- Presented a program in the auditorium on June 8: "The Be Like Brit Story: Past to Present" hosted by the Library Committee Continue planning for summer youth program week of June 21 with Lisa, up to 19 children enrolled with several service projects/activities planned. Volunteers: Jen Beck, Kathy Lindner, Charles Chester
- Wednesday Vespers on hold during summer months replaced with Prayer and Communion in the chapel June 8, 9, 22, and 23.
- Planning for first in-person service in the sanctuary the end of the month and Celebration
- Working on updating Digital and Communications Specialist position and forming hiring committee as per Governing Board decision
 - NOTE: Hiring Committee slate of Malta Bailey, Annetta Miller, Jim Davis and Andy McCabe was approved by consensus.
- Attending SNEC webinar on June 10: "A Fresh Start at Strengthening Relationships in Your Church" *Relationships between church members became more important than ever in the past year, as the nation struggled through multiple crises. Now the church has an opportunity to re-focus on relationships, introducing new strategies for church members to really listen and connect with one another. This session will cover getting to know people who are new to your congregation and reaching out to include people on the "fringes" of congregational life. Learn about creative ideas for small groups, events and programs to build connections and*

strategies for incorporating relationship-building into the rhythms of church life.

- SNEC Resiliency Time Capsule: Stories of Adaptation, Lessons for the Future” –sharing our story at SCC. Pastor Debbie will take the lead on this and work with Ministry Lead Coordinators to compile input.

- Pastor Debbie will draft an announcement in preparation of in-person gathering.
- Pastor Debbie will begin Time Capsule input collection
- Paul will work to coordinate office coverage while Deborah is on vacation
- Pastor Debbie will convene hiring committee for Communication and Digital Ministry Specialist position

SUNDAY MORNING SERVER INFORMATION

Have you ever wondered how you can help out on Sunday mornings? While the folks that help are valuable and indispensable in their service, what they do is not a special secret – you too can participate in the Sunday Morning Servers. Here is a brief write up of each role available, if you would like to be added to the scheduling rotation, or would like to sign up for any particular role for a specific Sunday, contact Deborah in the office to be signed up.

Fellowship Host: The goal of Fellowship Hour is for the entire church family (children, adults & guests) to gather to talk and get to know each other. Food and drink tend to provide a comfortable atmosphere for this gathering. Plan to arrive between 9:00 and 9:15 am to get everything prepped prior to the service. Coffee, tea, water, and a children's beverage, such as juice or lemonade, are generally served. Supplies are provided by Fellowship Board.

Flower Distributor: The Sunday flowers are distributed after Sunday Worship to the person who dedicated them or to a person designated at the Caring Ministry discretion. The Flowers will be prepared for delivery after worship and the flower recipient's name is recorded in the notebook located in the drawer near the PA system in the deacon's kitchen. The Flower Distributor either delivers the flowers themselves or arranges for the flowers to be delivered within a few days.

Flower Distributor for July is Cass Crewdson; for August is Jamie Lang-Rodean.

Greeter: Greeting is a wonderful opportunity to get to know people and for them to get to know you. Plan to arrive at church at 9:40 am and stand at the Meeting House doorway wearing your name tag, ready with a smile and greeting to make all arriving feel very welcome. This is a job that is great for individuals, families or groups of friends.

Head Usher: The Head Usher is a very important part of making certain that the service flows smoothly. Plan to arrive at 9:30 am. Duties prior to the service involve making certain the sanctuary is ready for the service and all doors are unlocked, lights are on, bulletins are brought over from the copy room, candles are lit, and other ushers are instructed as necessary. During the service, the head usher leads when the offering is collected and makes certain that attendance is recorded, including choir and children. After the service, tidying up the pews, extinguishing candles, turning off the lights, and locking the doors are necessary. Prior experience ushering is helpful.

Usher: Another great way wonderful way to get to know people and for them to get to know you. Plan to arrive at 9:40 am. Duties will include greeting and helping people as they arrive. As needed, handing out bulletins, helping with the offering collection and attendance count, helping with the flow of communion and if necessary, tidying up after service. This is a great job for individuals, families and groups of friends. No experience ushering is required. The Head Usher will show you the ropes.

Liturgist: The lay liturgist partners with the pastor(s) in leading our congregation's worship services. In a typical Sunday service, the lay liturgist will lead: the **Call to Worship**, the opening **Prayer of the Day**, the **Peace** (*including the invitation for worshippers to pass the peace to each other, which is not printed out for you in the bulletin*), the **Prayer for Illumination**, and the **Scripture** readings, including leading the responsive **Psalter** reading if one is included in the service. The Scripture readings, prayers and bulletin are provided via email during the week leading to the Sunday

Welcome Table Host: This role is an opportunity for folks that enjoy meeting new people that visit the church. Plan to be in the Narthex by 9:40 a.m. to prepare the yellow visitor bags with "goodies" that you've either purchased or baked (*baked goods with nuts should be labeled*) and SCC brochures, magnets and a prayer square. The Welcome Table Host also provides temporary Name Tags and a Registry Sign-in Sheet for visitors as well as offers an invitation to participate in all aspects of worship and the Fellowship time that follows.

The Sunday Morning Server Schedule is released a week prior to the beginning of the upcoming month or liturgical season and will be posted in the Parish House outside of the Main Office on the "Fellowship" bulletin board. If you'd like to be added to the email group that receives an electronic copy of the schedule, please let Deborah know.

VACANT roles in the schedule need to be filled. If you are interested in a **VACANT** spot, contact the "Role Contact" listed below or Deborah in the office to be assigned and arrange for training if needed.

As restrictions continue to be lifted, there has been increasing use of the courtyard and play area. Thanks to a number of volunteers, these areas have gotten a facelift. Paul Schur was a great help in weeding and spreading 22 bags of mulch around shrubs on the property. The planting bed alongside the play area has always been an eyesore. An attempt at planting pachysandra there two years ago ended in failure because of the poor soil quality. With the help of Dave Jordan and the ever-dependable Paul Schur, we removed 10 inches of the sandy mix and replaced it with about three cubic yards of topsoil. Shortly after, Dave and Carol Jordan planted a mix of Vinca and Siberian Iris, both of which are certain to thrive in this partially shaded area.

Sue, Lindsey and Emily Irvine painted the four, heavily used benches in the courtyard and office area. Also, what will become a colorful shrub was added on the front side of the Chapel. There are plans in the works to relocate the bench dedicated to Foster Lindley to outside the courtyard wall, along the walkway to the Meeting House. It has been said that Foster always enjoyed listening to the Carillon and this is an excellent location for that. Thank you to the volunteers who help to beautify our grounds and buildings for all to enjoy.

LIBRARY NEWS

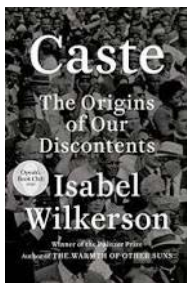
Welcome Back Everyone!
